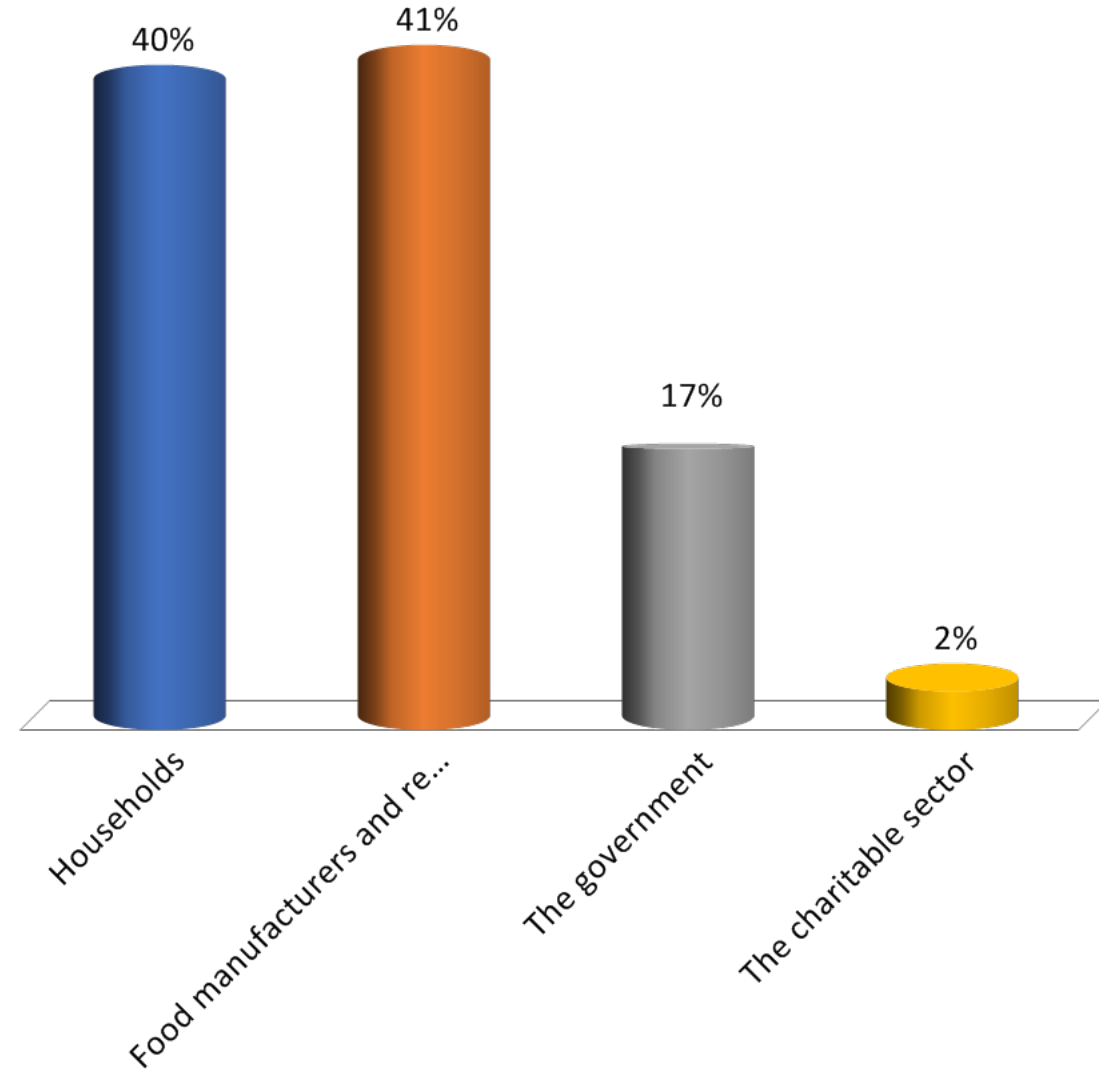

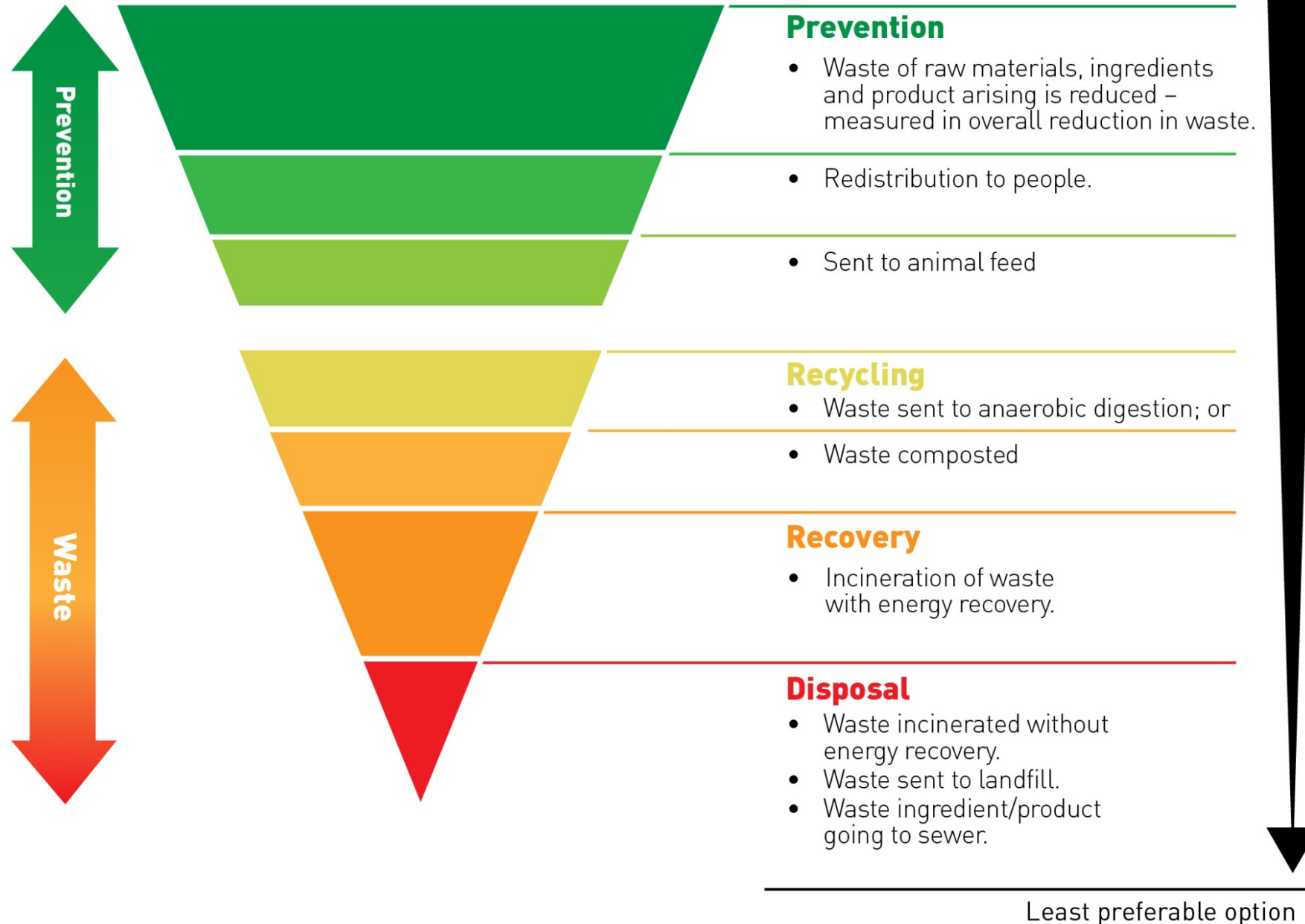

Most preferable option

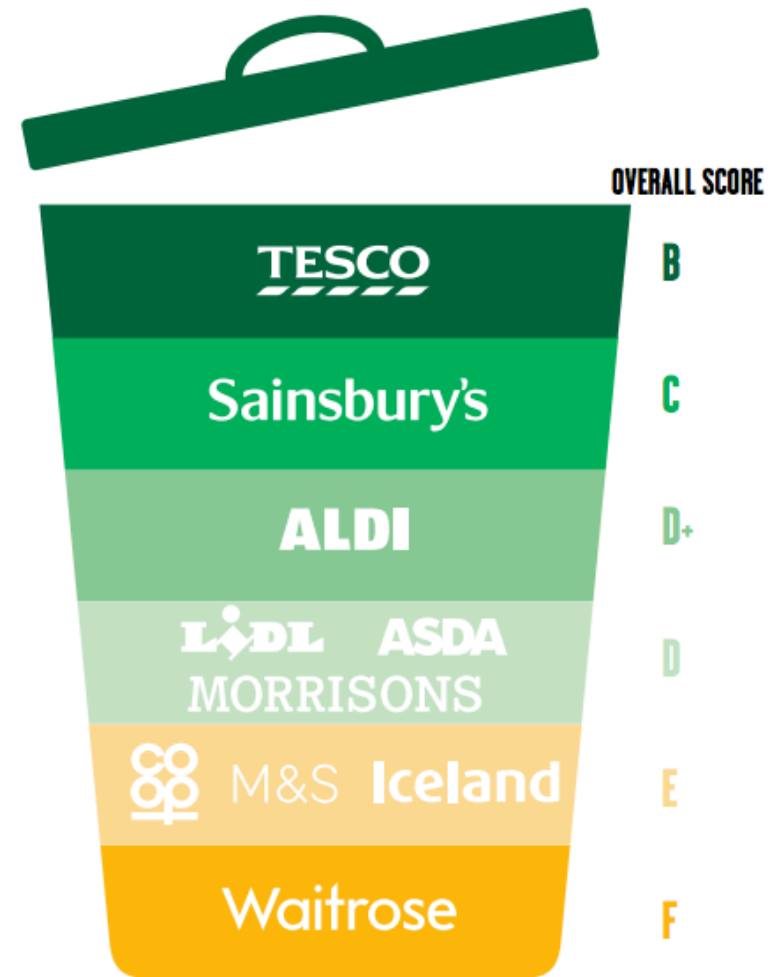

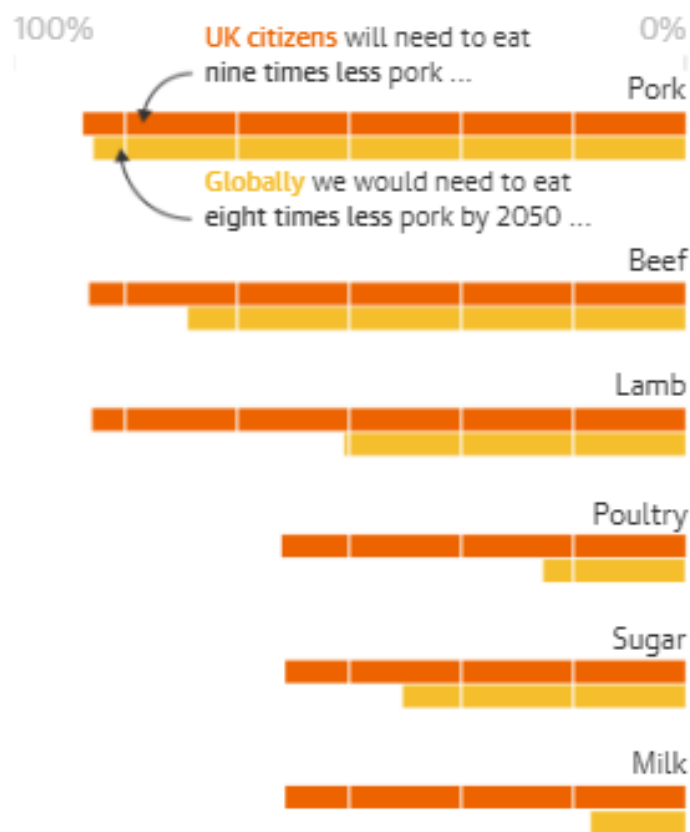


THE FEEDBACK FOOD WASTE SUPERMARKET SCORECARD

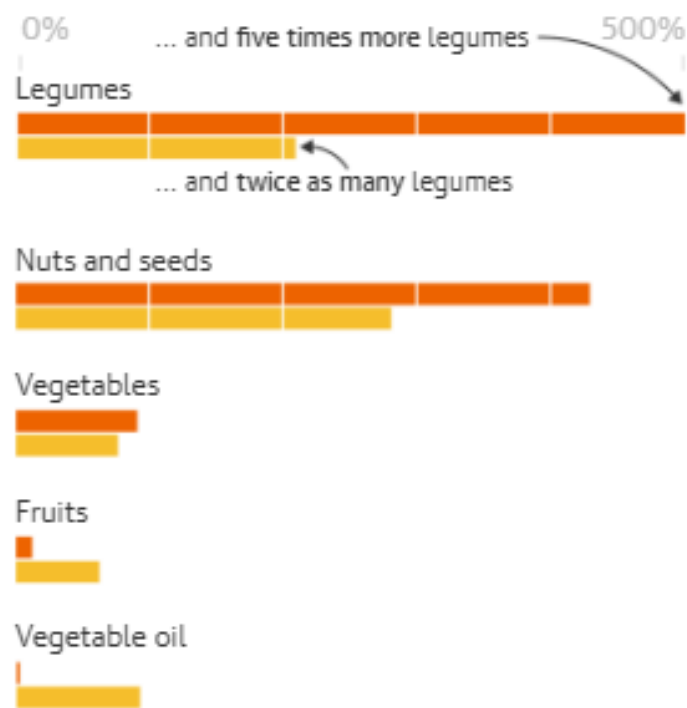




To keep global temperature rises to under 2C by 2050, we need to eat much less of these foods ...

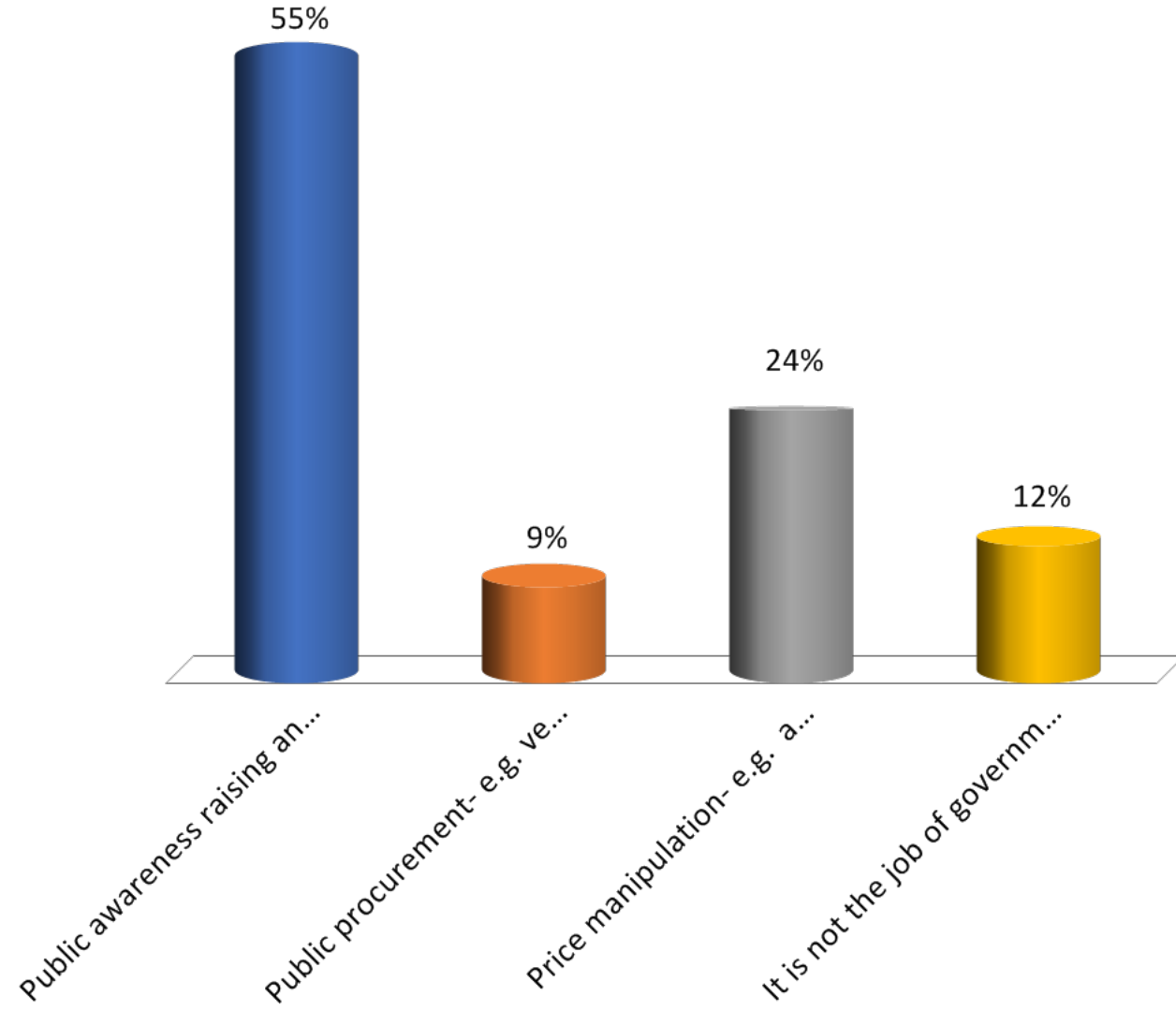

To help support reduced meat consumption, the government should prioritise:
